




Phones are collected in at the start of the day, stored safely away during the day and returned to the children at the end of the day.







A residential trip has been booked for 14th - 18th November (4 nights).


. Children from Years 5 and 6 will be staying at Sayers Croft in Ewhurst, Surrey.

- . Thursday: Xantus & Rufus


Remember, on these days, you will show your 5 reading records of reading at home to an adult. It will need to have the book read, the date and be signed by the grown up.
